

Five Types of Phrases: Cheat Sheet

Type of Phrase	Use	Cue	<b>Punctuation Rules</b>
Prepositional	Adjective or adverb	Begins with a preposition	Use a comma after an introductory phrase:  • If the phrase is long  • If two or more words appear together
Participal	Adjective	Verb form ending in -ed or -ing	Use a comma after an introductory phrase
Gerund	Noun	Verb form ending in -ing	None
Infinitive	Noun, adjective or adverb	Starts with "to" + verb	Use a comma after an introductory phrase when NOT used as the subject
Appositive	Adjective	<ul><li>Next to pronoun/noun</li><li>Is a noun/pronoun</li></ul>	Use a comma to set off nonessential appositive phrases
